
Well, they said it couldn't be done, but once again the Miraleste High School guidance counselors have disproved the old saying, "Many receive advice, but few profit from it."

Humanities is Man's search for understanding himself through his history, philosophy, art, the social sciences.


Man seeks answers to the age-old questions. Who am I? Where did I come from? Where am I going? What is life? What is truth? What is justice? What is love? Why society? Why government?




What is it like to live during the Depression? Or in ancient Greece, the cradle of democracy? How do archeologists understand primitive symbols?



In an era when everyone seems to be talking about communication... and talking, and talking, the foreign studies department is working to provide students with the real basis for communication: Language.


With the knowledge gained in a French, German, or Spanish course, a student is on the road to understanding the culture, history, literature of any country, to capture the minds of a people.

The SCROC and Work Experience which were offered to MHS students during the 1971-72 school year provided a great opportunity for students to receive school credit while doing a paid job or learning a valuable skill.

SCROC (Southern California Regional Occupational Center) was a great chance for over 100 students to pursue study in areas not covered in a normal high school program. MHS students were enrolled in a wide variety of subjects, ranging from auto repair to secretarial training. Not only was this service free to students, but bus service was supplied from MHS to the center, which is located in Torrance.


Work Experience provided a chance for students to hold a part or full-time paying or non-paying job, take a shortened day, and work during school hours for school credit.

From MHS there were over 40 students working in paying jobs, and approximately 20 students enrolled in non-paying, educational-type jobs. These jobs ranged from box-boys to teachers assistants, and from cashiers to serving lunch duty at nearby elementary schools.



Coach Lucas was named to coach the East team in the East-West Shrine game, to end the season on a good note.














THE ALMOST AUTOMATIC penalty shot is scored here by Paul Rabinov against a Rolling Hills goalie.






































Top players this year were Scott Benson, Linsay Olson, Mark Ellis, and Mark Thomas. These players formed the nucleus of the Marauder team.










With these three swimmers and the two divers, Clay Eliot and Paul Gagon, the Marauders formed a team that was hard to beat.
















