The Miraleste High School crest has the school colors of red and gold. The shield is on a background of two crossed Spanish Swords. To further portray the Spanish heritage of California, a Spanish Marauder sits triumphantly on top.

Separating the red and the gold colors is a jagged diagonal line, similar to stairs, called a Dancette. This line represents the terraces of the MHS campus, its most distinctive architectural

feature.

A ship's lantern is imprinted on the gold portion of the shield. This lantern reminds students of the nearby harbors and represents the lamp of learning.

A compass pointing east is on the red portion of the shield. Symbolically, it means "Miraleste" or "look to the east." The compass, a "guide of direction," stresses the importance education plays in the student's lives.

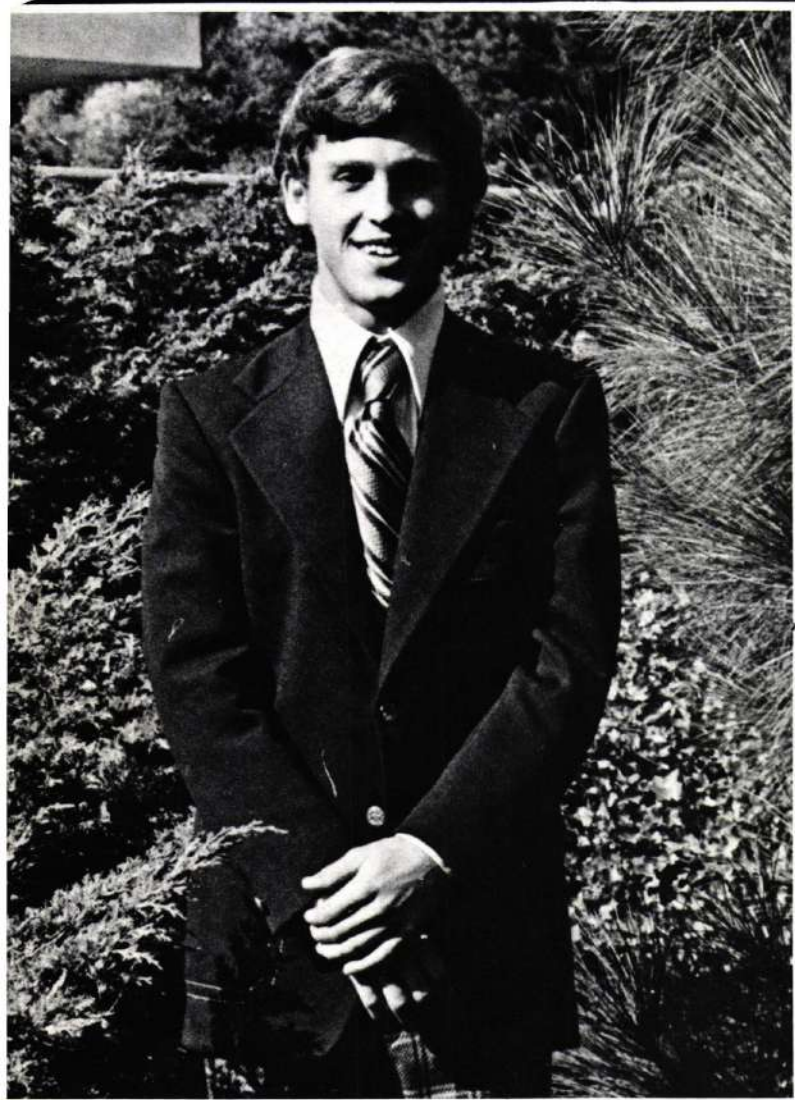
Since it was the fifth class to graduate from Miraleste, the Class of '74 was a very productive class.

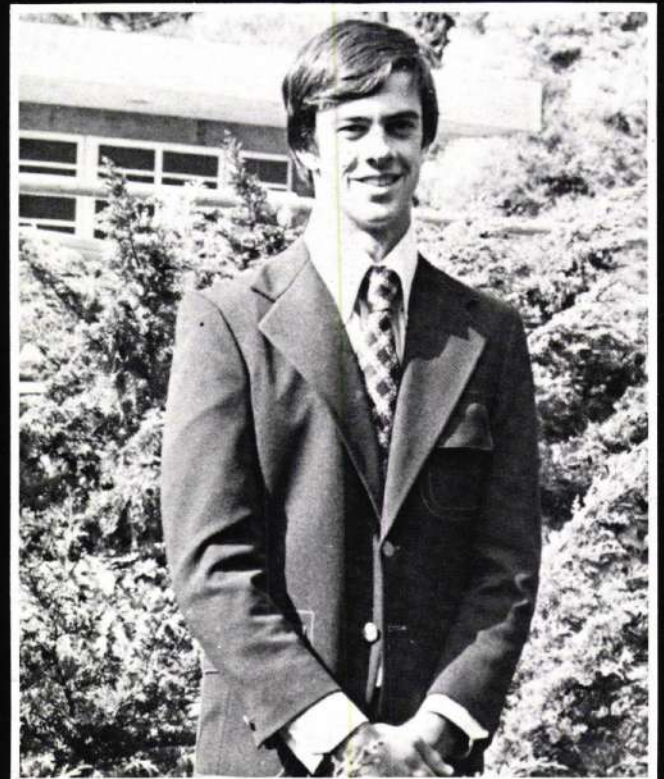
The class, showing all its charisma, then introduced Miraleste to the surfing film world.

The new music drama building is just the first of several additional facilities proposed to maintain a first-rate program.



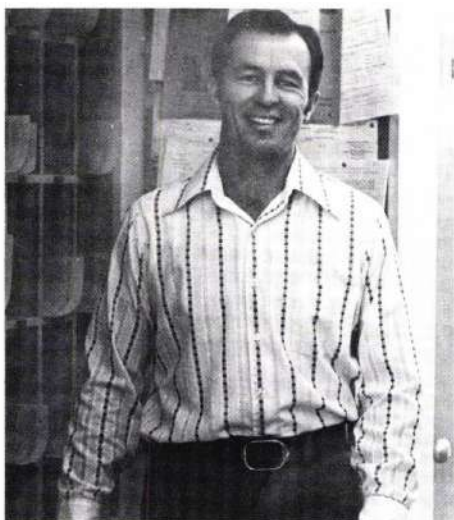

With the help of the Music Boosters Club and with the additional space available in the new Fine Arts building, Mrs. Wilma White and the choirs have had a fine year.

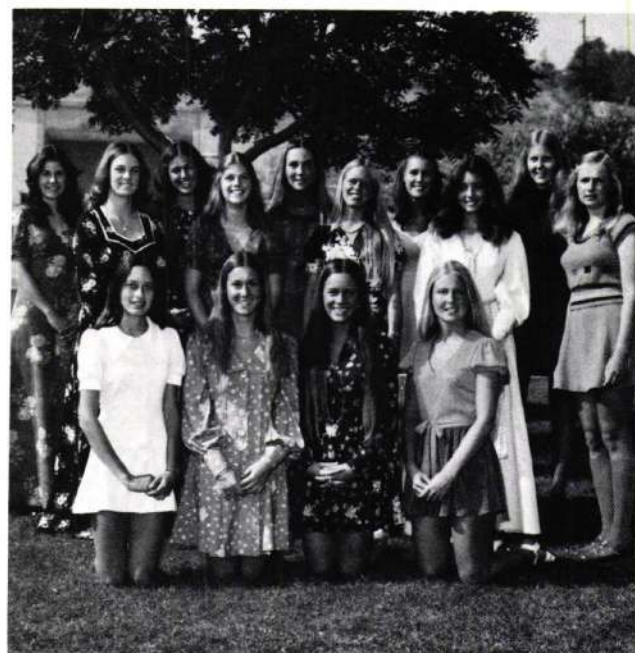

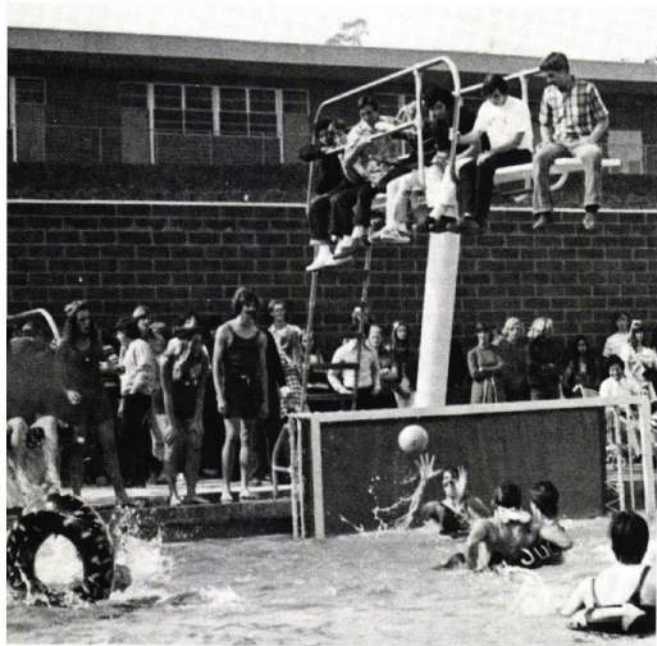

While the art classes continued to grow in popularity, solid courses (math, science, humanities) did not decrease in number of students. But with the addition of portables and teachers, class size decreased, encouraging more individualized attention and new ideas in teaching.

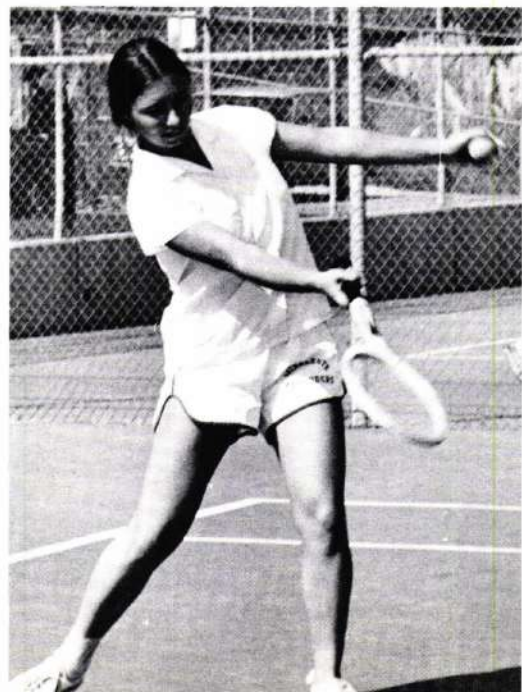




Physical Education

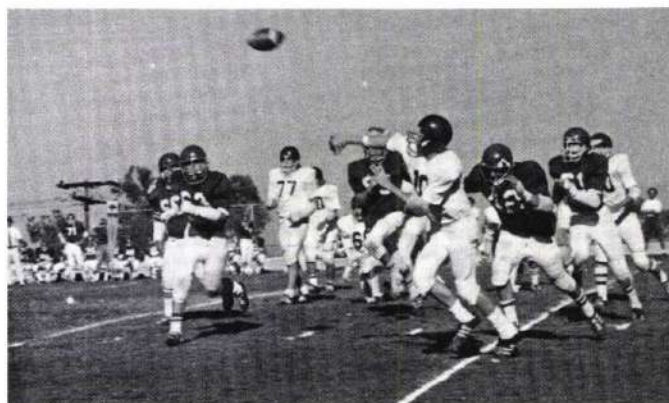

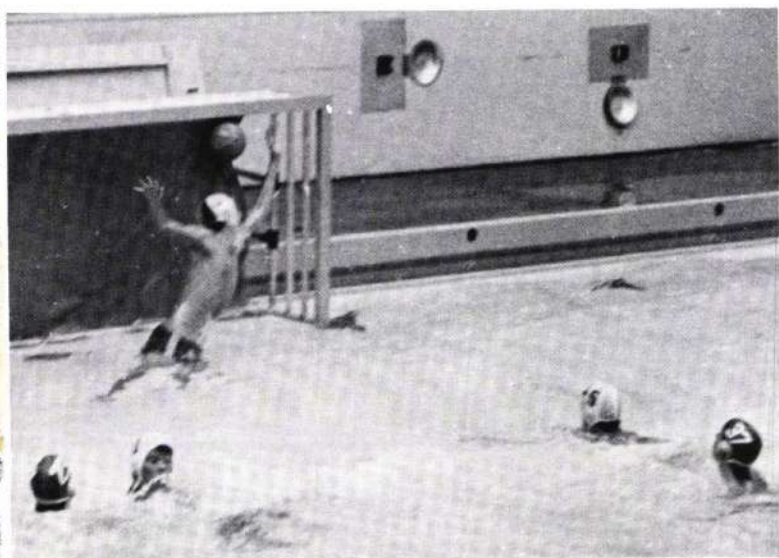

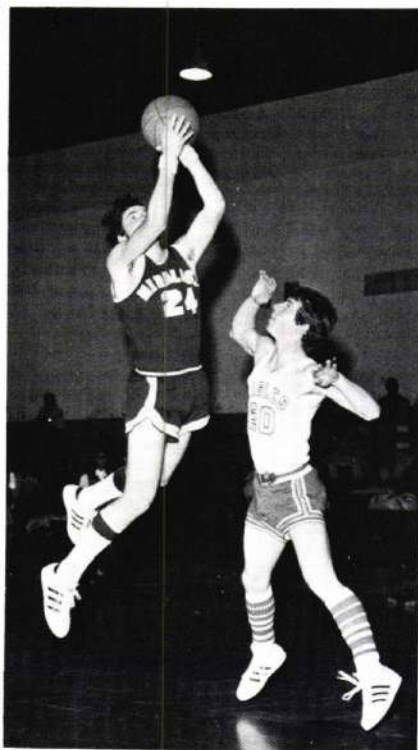

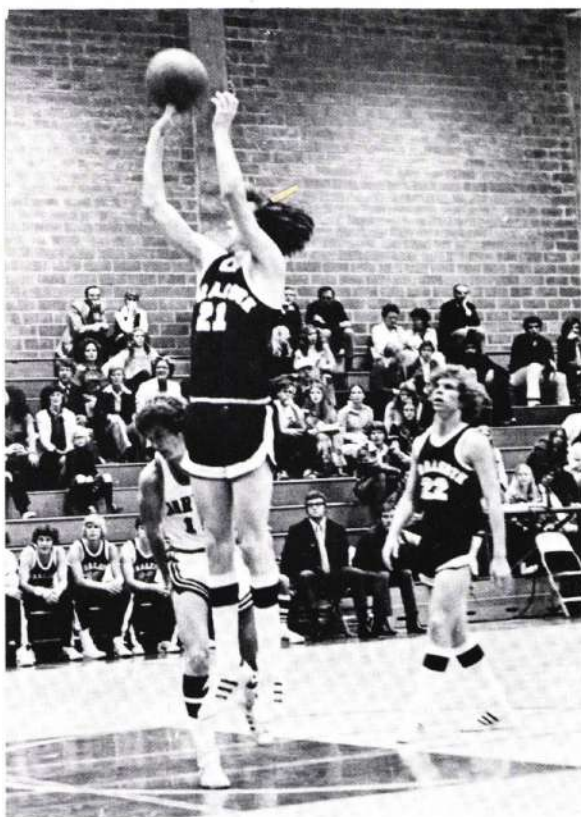

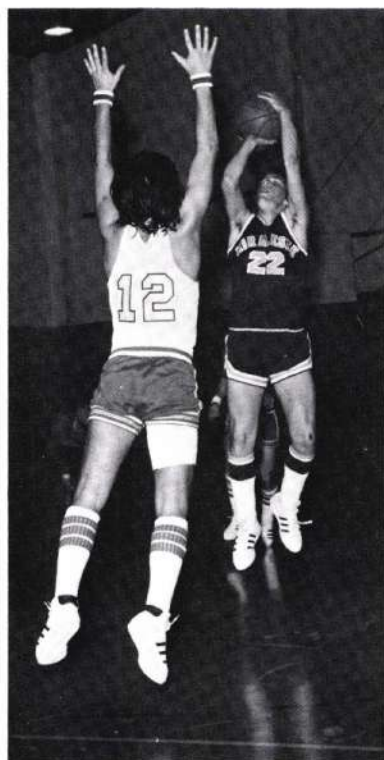

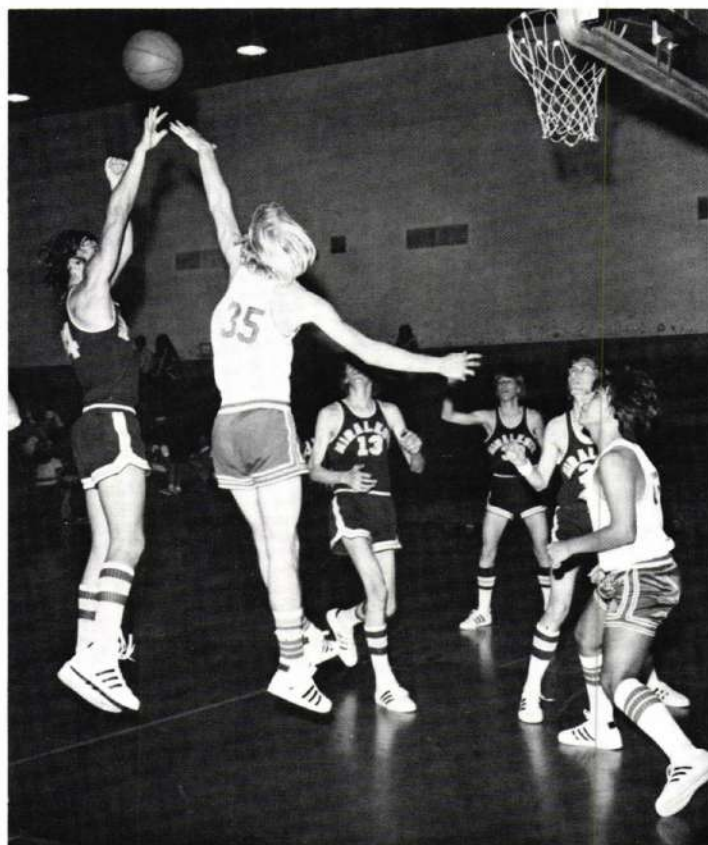

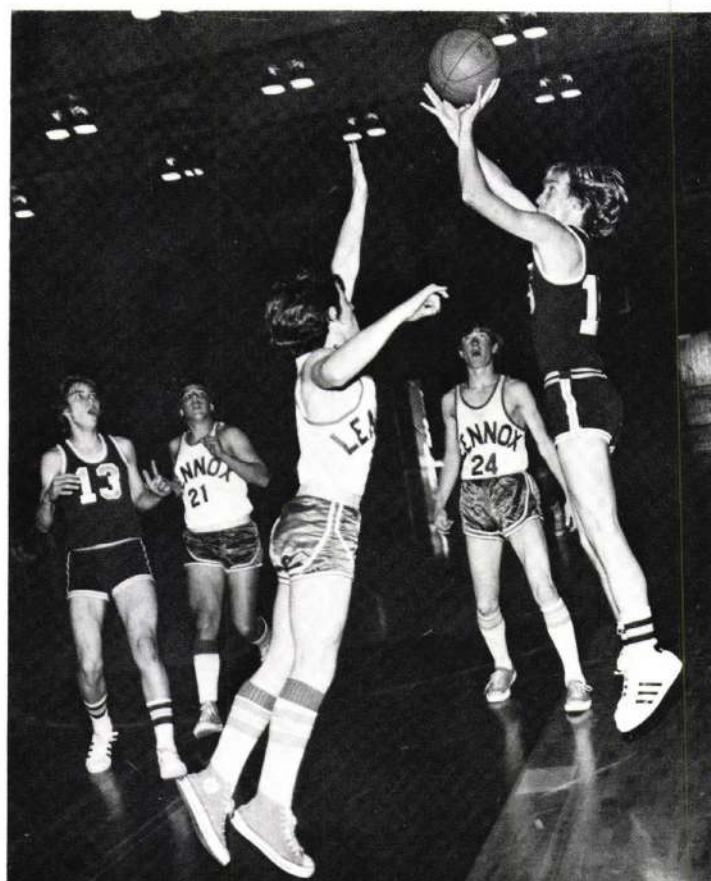


High scoring guard Steve Koehler leaps above his opponent to hit one of his consistent jump shots.

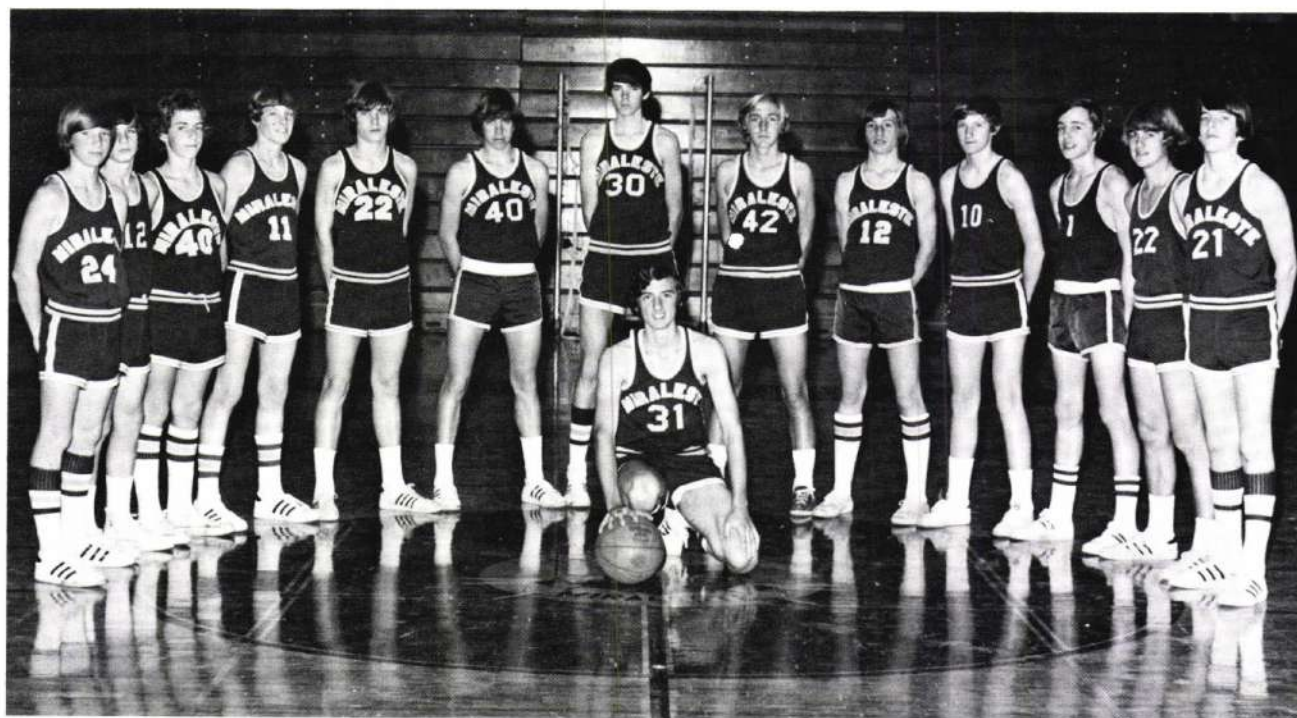

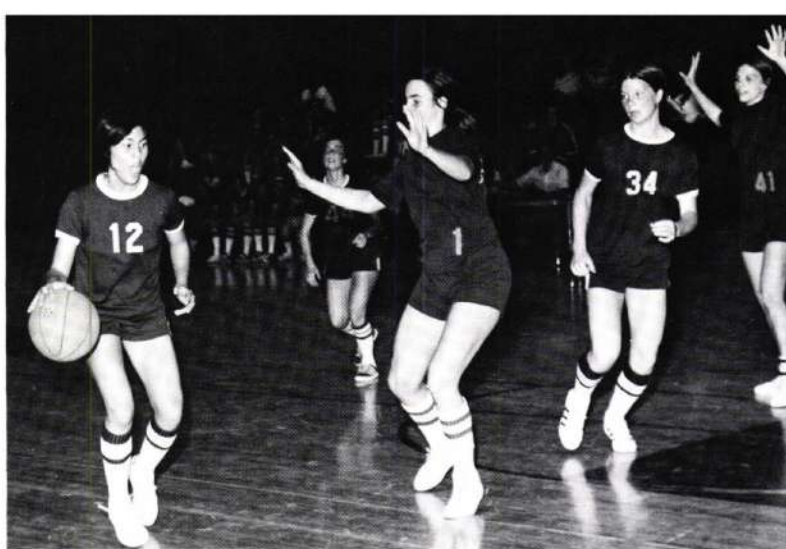

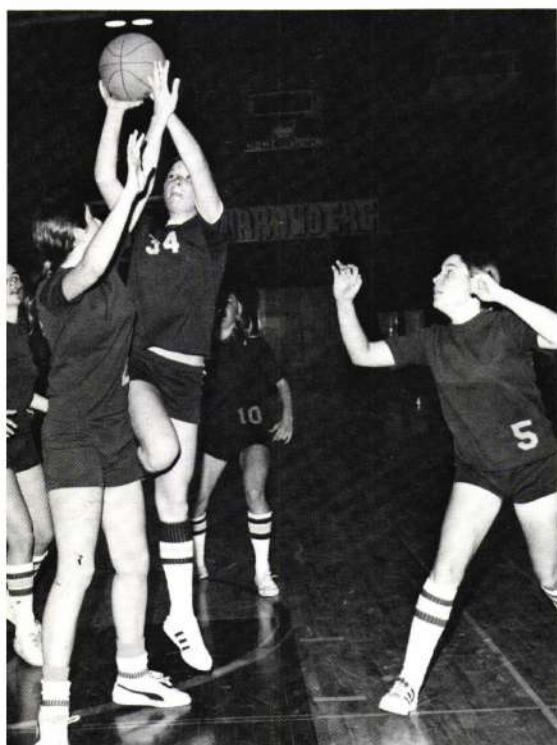




With a soft touch, Joan Baker puts a shot in for two points.

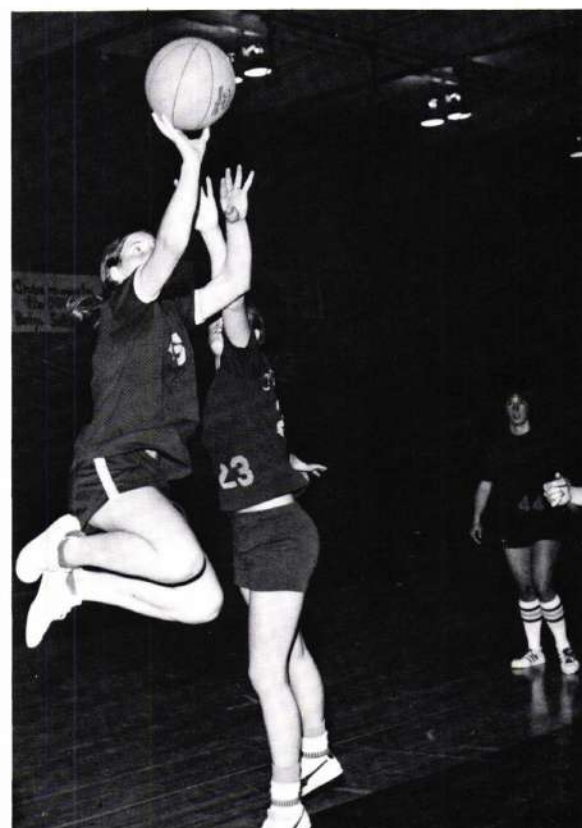


Junior guard Nannette Demonteverde works the ball around as center Beth Menze makes a cut for the basket.

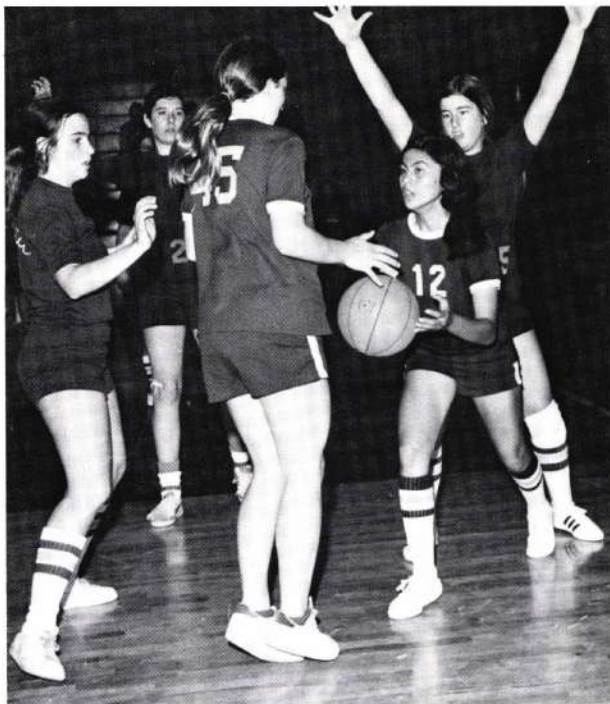

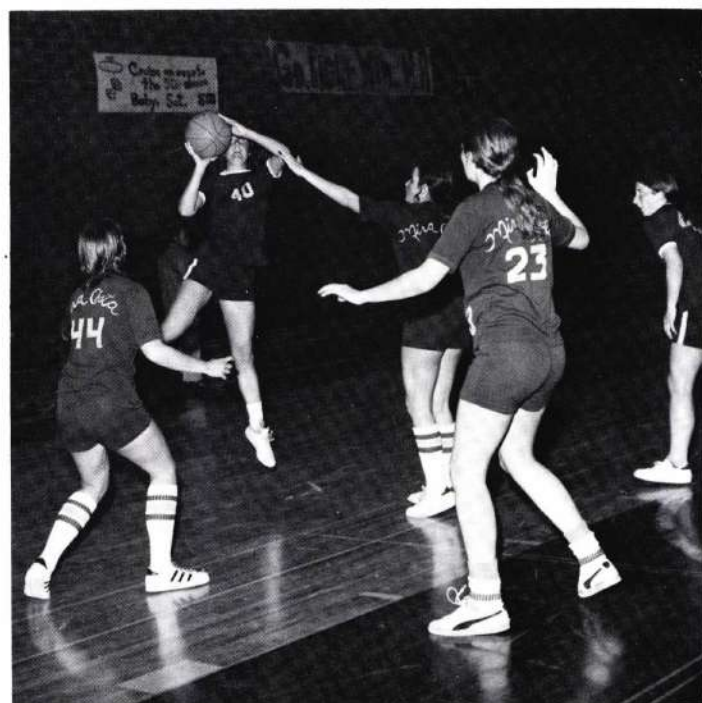


Finding the defense too stiff, Nannette Demonteverde passes off to a teammate who looks for open shot or a chance to drive to the basket.

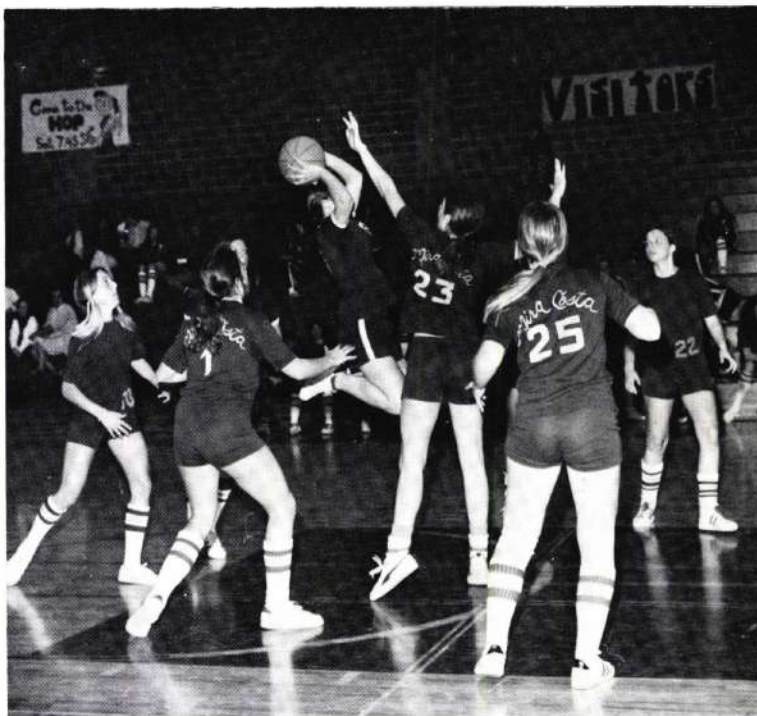

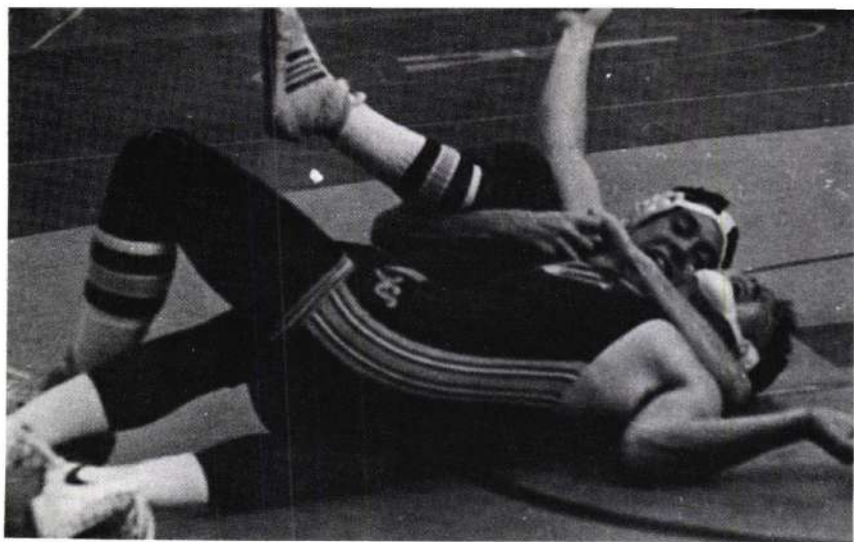

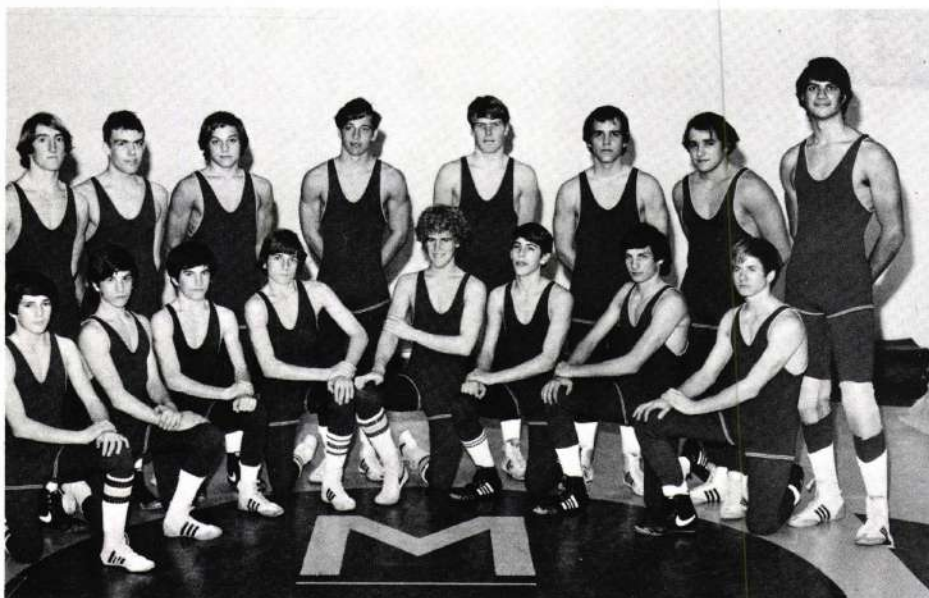

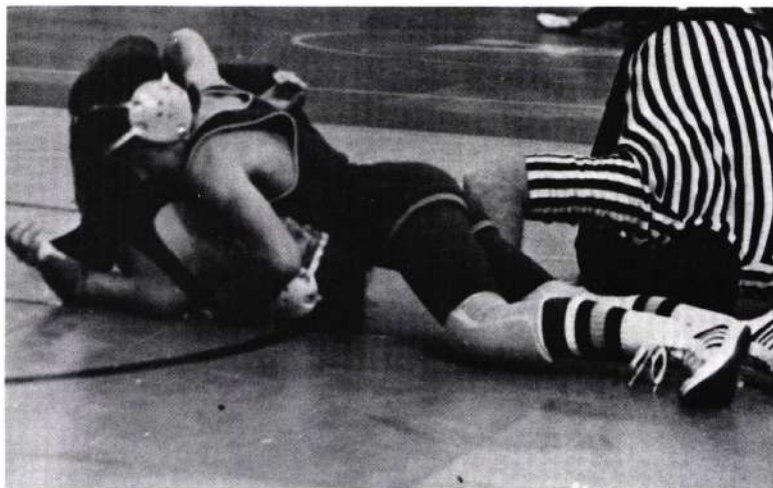

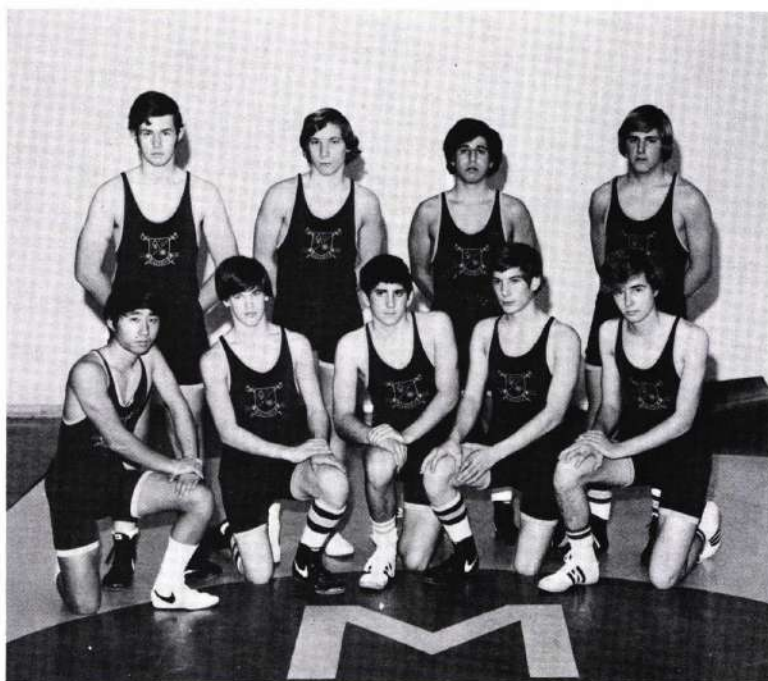

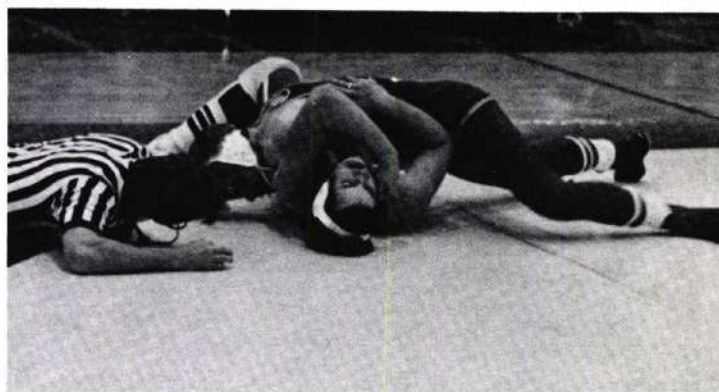

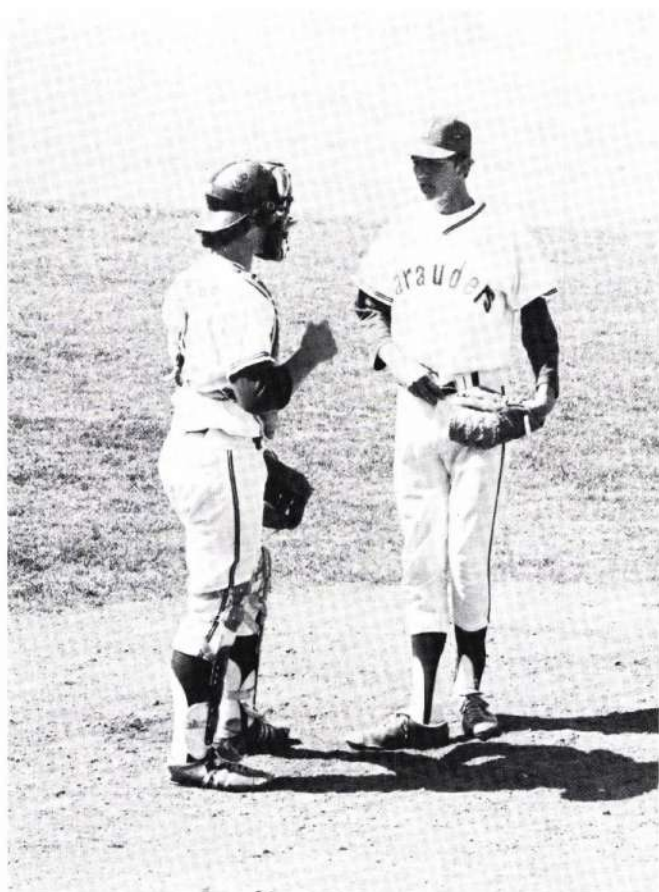

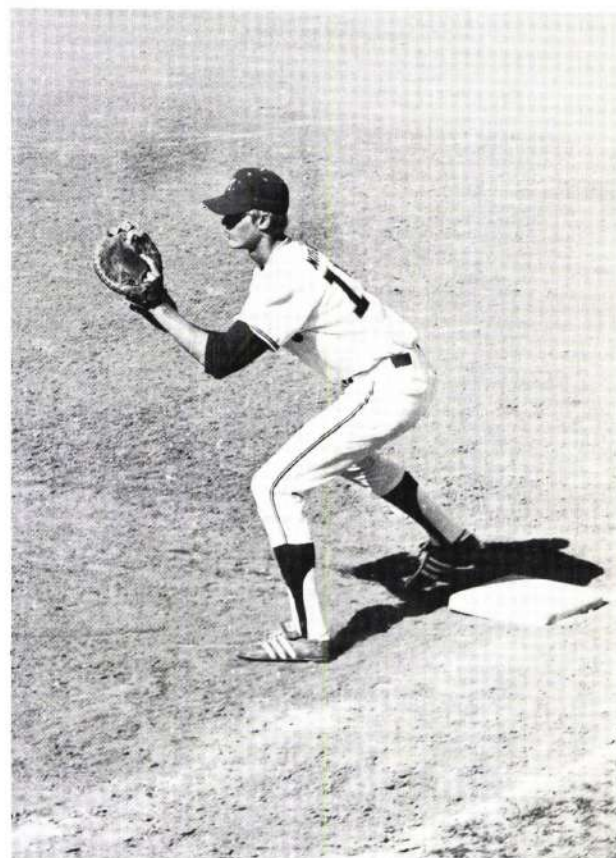

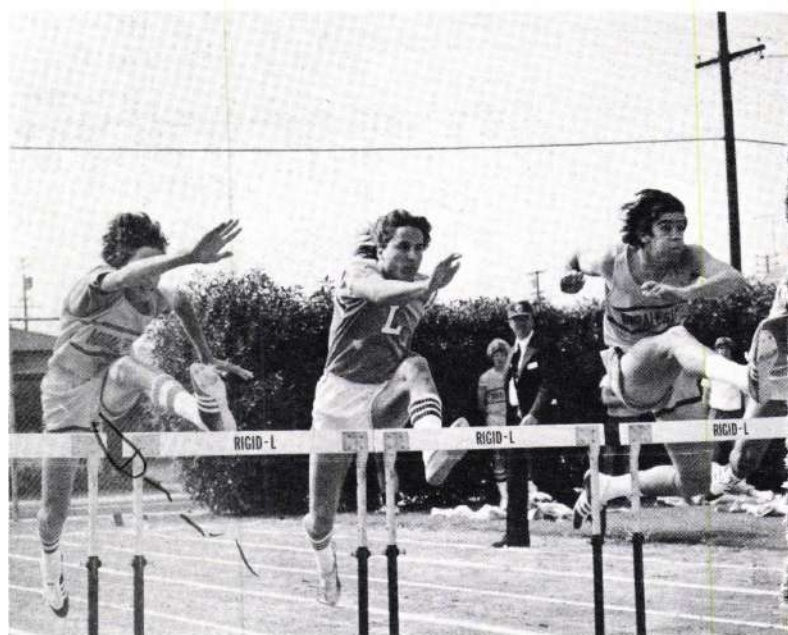

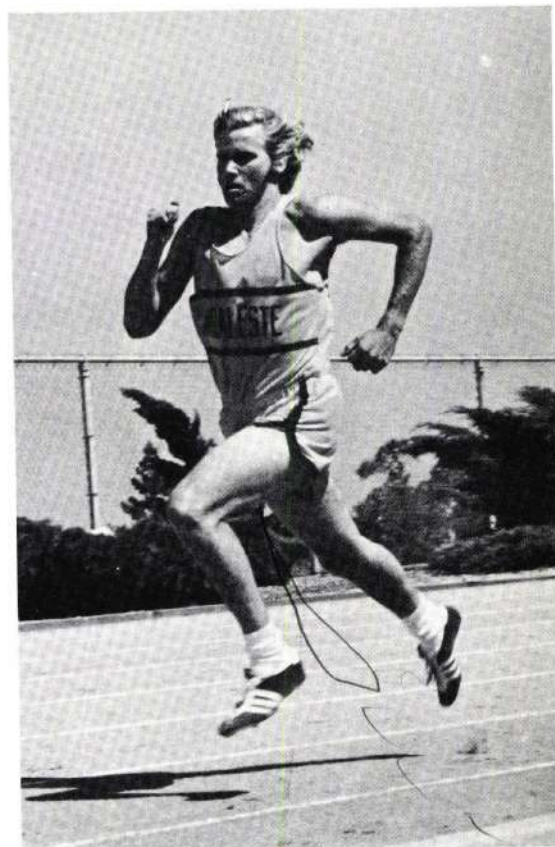

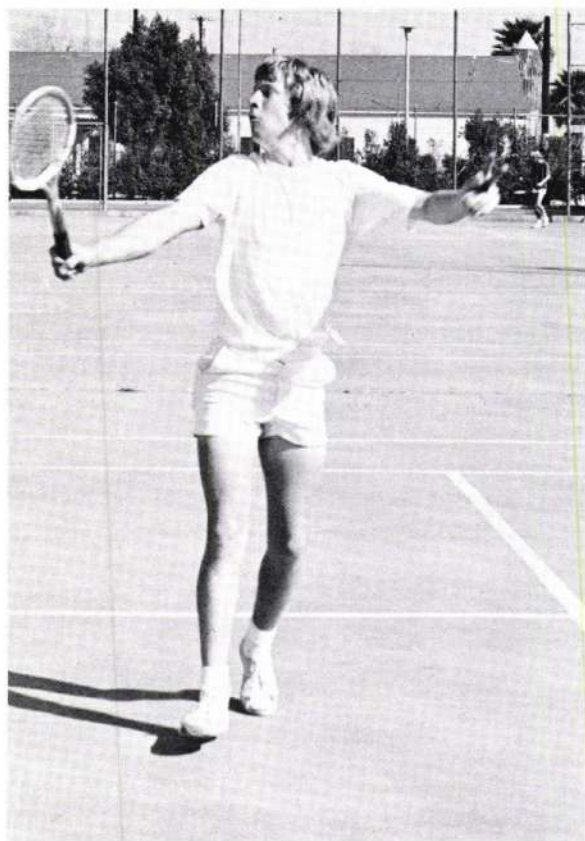

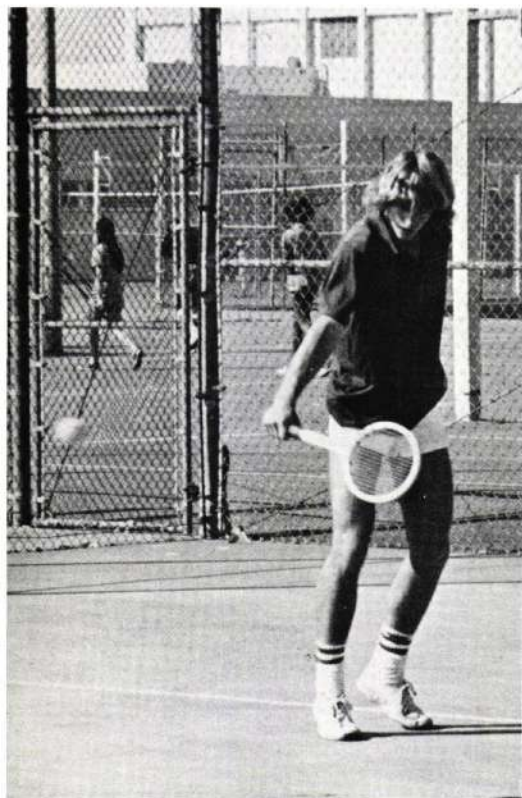

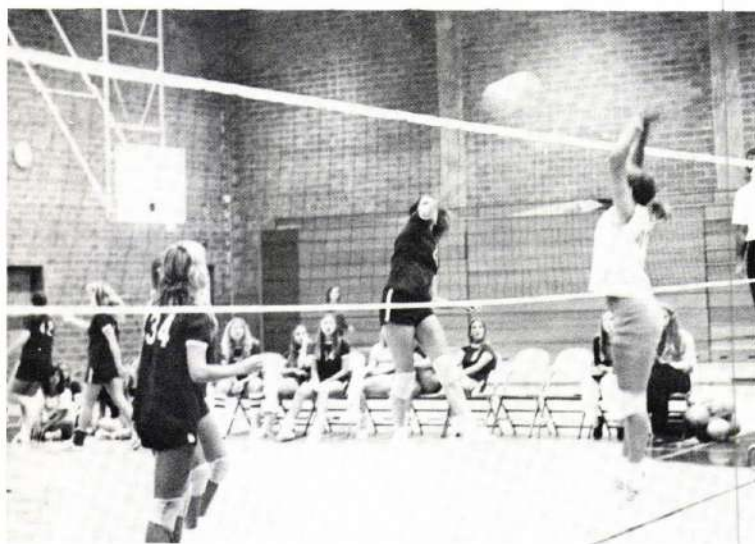

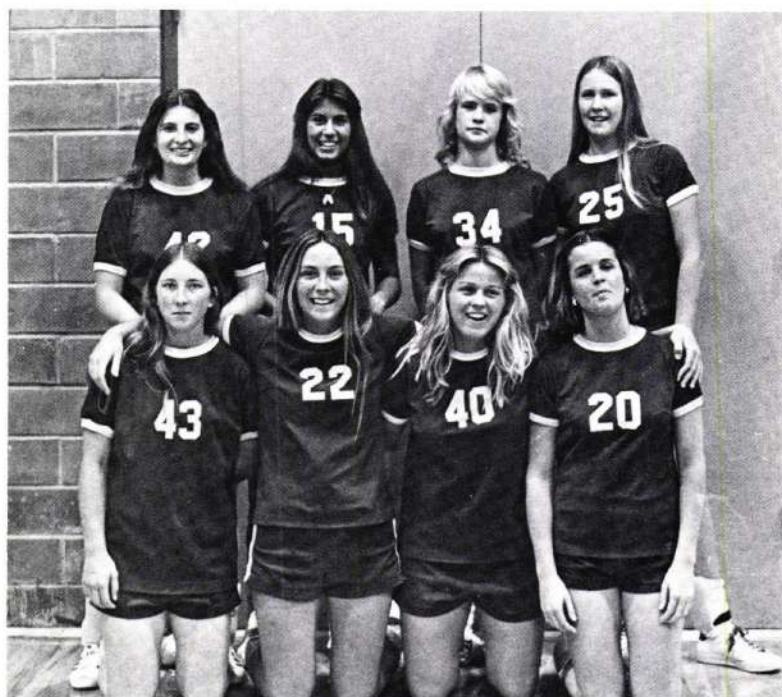

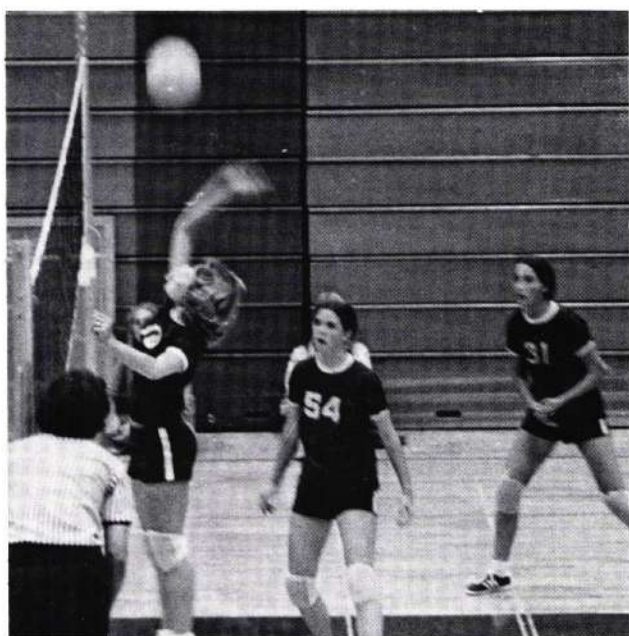

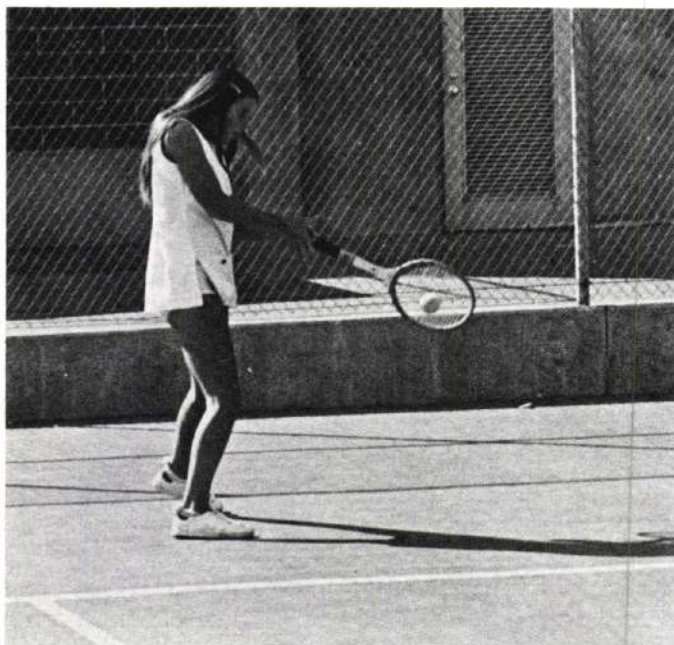

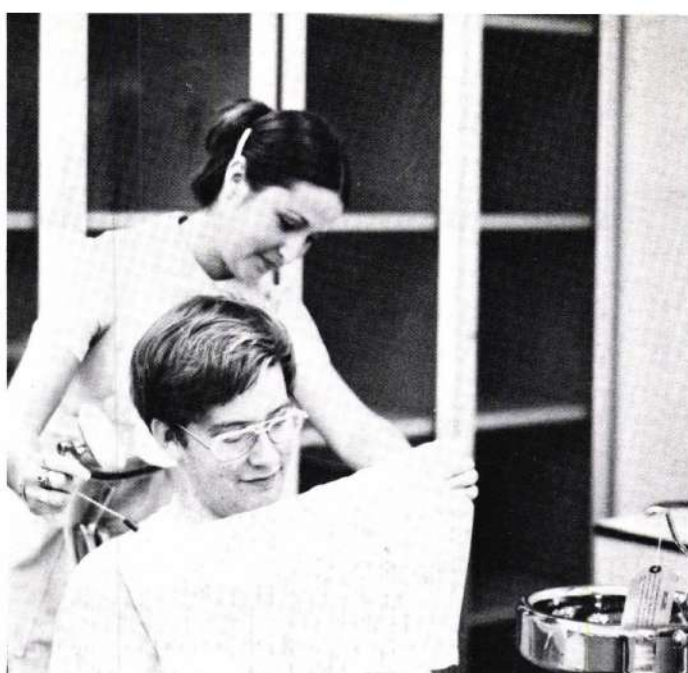
