Administrators were also concentrating on updating board policies and implementing a new law on school employees.






Many students were taking one of their required English or language courses by the time second period rolled around. Foreign language courses were French, Spanish, or German. Some even took English as a foreign language.

# Marauders Start Strong End Injured


















# Marauder Wrestlers Impressive in League










# Varsity Cagers Take Second; Advance to CIF Again




MHS guard, Don Ricketts, reverses his dribble and puts Millikan player away.




































This year's advanced drama class really got into action under the guidance of the new Miraleste drama teacher, Ms. Dixie Stevens.










The second of our multi-ethnic experiences focused on the Afro-American culture.










#### DRILL TEAM






#### Orchestra: More People, Better Sound

Both choral groups were under the direction of Gladys Evans.






### Career Center
