## Leadership Camp Builds Understanding















## Spirit Week

Among the other activities was a pie-throwing contest which pitted the football players against the cheerleaders in a test of skill.












# Spirit Week

Miraleste laid claim to a world record, stringing together a flip top chain 2,169 feet long.



# Fall Play






# Pep Squad






### **Formal**


### Madrigals/Chorus

Also chosen by popular vote were the class Sweethearts. The semi-formal sweetheart dance, starring the music of "Brass Knuckles," honored the nominees.









During the 1976-1977 school year, a team of teachers and administrators worked as a committee to develop a set of Minimum Writing Standards which covered the school years from kindergarten through grade twelve. The major thrust this year was to implement these Minimum Writing Standards. A Committee prepared supplementary materials and an evaluation program was developed for students at the end of grades three, five, eight, and eleven.

In addition to the development of the Minimum Writing Standards, the high school teachers of English developed for each course offered in English a statement of the goals and objectives so that students at the three high schools would study the same courses

The district has continued this curriculum development in other areas during the 1977-78 school

Congratulations to the Class of 1978! Both individually and as a class, you have excelled in academics, athletics, and the continued development of the co-curricular program.


I hope that this yearbook provides you with reflections on the school curriculum, personal development and friendships that you have experienced during your years at Miraleste High School.

The Assistant Principals of Miraleste High School have duties as varied as supervision of the guidance office and the development of proper student conduct and attitudes. They also have responsibility for the athletic program for both boys and girls. They implement control of students and periodic evaluation of teachers. In addition to Mr. Ron Terry, we had a new assistant principal in the person of Mr. James Ryan, formerly of Rolling Hills High School.

The new dean of student activities, Mr. John Letcher, came from Pioneer High School. As dean of student activities he was responsible for coordinating and planning all the after school events. He also worked with the various clubs and class sponsors to improve the social life of the Miraleste campus.

PTSA at Miraleste High School exists for the benefit of our students. PTSA provides volunteers to work in many school areas, helps with communication by mailing the Torreon and the Que Pasa to each student's home, and, this year, conducted a tour of the Tom Heisheimer, A. L. Wooden, Warren Palmer, and Kenneth Dennis homes to fund these efforts.

Work experience gives students an opportunity to experience growth, to develop a sense of worth and responsibility toward self and the community, and to realize the relationship between academic school work and the world of work. The Career Center provides a reference source for students. Mr. Steve Xenos, in charge of the work experience program, worked towards providing exploratory, general and vocational work experiences.

Mrs. Flora Thoman, Miraleste High School Librarian since the opening of school in 1968-69, takes charge of the management of the library. In fact, she was hired a year early, in 1967, to help plan the library and to acquire books and equipment. Her work includes budgeting school money for the library, ordering audio visual aids, cataloging all materials, and training library students. She served for a number of years as media consultant for the state of California, and has taught at Cal State Long Beach.



During the 1977-1978 school, Miraleste High's English Department experienced dramatic changes. A systematic and sequential approach to both grammar and composition was instituted with courses such as Grammar Usage and Composition A, Composition B, Composition C, and Grammar and Usage, and through the utilization of a new grammar text.

The department was able to assess students' progress and needs through district testing at both the freshmen and junior levels. Minimum writing standards gave the department a cohesiveness. Finally, as a result of tremendous effort exerted by district administrators, Lucile Crain and Dr. Robert Ferrera, representatives from the high school English departments, and many of our own staff, we were able to implement the Blue Book, a large notebook which contains course outlines, goals and objectives, and lists of texts, supplements, and films.

Having additional texts and supplements, having direction, and having many fine new teachers in the school has filled Miraleste High's English Department with enthusiasm and optimism.




The Performing Fine Arts department trains students in skills and talents in drama, speech, and instrumental and vocal music. Students within this area are involved in different fields of their interest.











### Girls' Varsity X-Country Takes 3rd in Close Race



# Architectural Plans for Miraleste High Unveiled



THIRD HIGH SCHOOL - Donley, Bundy & Associates, architects, have prepared this artist's rendering of Miraleste high school as it will look some day. In the foreground is Palos Verdes Drive East looking up the terraced campus toward San Pedro Hill. The first increment to house 1000 students is projected for use in the fall of 1968.

As unveiled at Monday's meeting of the board of education by James E. Crockett, business manager, the plans call for a minimum of fixed walls. Instead many of the walls will be constructed of uniform panels which fit into special grooves and as teaching methods change, they may be moved to increase or decrease the size of classrooms.

Crockett emphasized that this is not the same as removable walls such as folding doors which can be opened and closed. Some of the classrooms will be equipped with the latter. Some classrooms, such as art, shop and science, by nature of their use will have fixed walls.

Heating and ventilating equipment will be mounted on the roof and the flexible ducts can also be relocated as the walls are relocated.

In order to achieve this flexibility and stay within costs, Crockett explained it was necessary to substitute painted high density concrete blocks for brick exterior. He estimated the brick would cost \$1.50 per square foot more.

Board member Howard West predicted that future paint jobs would eventually cost more than the brick exterior. Crockett replied that new paints and a large overhang would prolong the necessity for repainting.

According to the administration it is hoped the first increment will be available for use in the school year '68-'69 and house 1000 students. A second increment to house an additional 1000 would probably be added two years after occupancy.

Site preparation is estimated at \$1,078,005. First increment estimate is \$1,682,248 and the second \$1,660,505 for a total contract of \$4,420,758. Work not in the contract totals \$76,000.

The first increment in addition to standard classrooms will include administration offices, library, science, homemaking, art and shop rooms. Shower and locker rooms are included but no gymnasium. Playfields are included with tennis courts to come in the second increment. Some of the administration and library areas will be utilized for classrooms in the first increment

A large eating area in the first increment can also be used for large group instruction. It will later be converted to classrooms. Present plans are to transport food from Rolling Hills high school.
