Spirit Week **Awakens** Miraleste

























Marauders Come Home



At the annual Key Club Masquerade dance a tie was declared and both **Jeff Brown** and **Sebron Tucker** were announced Homecoming Kings.










Band and Banner March to Victory

The Banner Squad proudly carried the Miraleste name at every game, event and parade.




Formal Leaves Fond Memories


The annual Girls' League Christmas Formal was held at the Proud Bird Restaurant.

You Can't Take It With You







Pep Squad Provides Spirit

Madrigals and Girls' Ensemble also gave a spring concert as well as several performances at elementary schools and women's clubs.






Work Experience is an opportunity for students to get high school credit outside of class. There are about 150 Juniors and Seniors currently involved in the program.


Credit is given to students working in both paying and volunteer work.

ings. As the ultimate authority on student control, Terry had to deal with student problems and discipline.
































Varsity Lettermen Go To C.I.F.



Violent unrest in Iran, uneasy peace in the Middle East, war in Asia. These are only a few of the world events that characterized the 78-79 school year, but MHS students were more concerned with speed bumps, the new cafeteria's french fries, and the often disastrous changes wrought by Proposition 13.

'Why us?'' "We never have decent books." "Why is the lawn so messy?" Miraleste responded, puzzled by the cut backs made necessary by Proposition 13. Not only the athletic department, but the size of the teaching staff, the janitorial staff, the PVP library district, and the academic and supply budgets were affected by the reduction in taxes.








Coaches found that their duties were increased as a result of shrinking staffs. Teams such as J.V. Football and Wrestling were eliminated, to the chagrin of many athletes. There was less money available to buy uniforms, balls, and other equipment, so teams often had to raise the money themselves, or make do with last year's version.

Much of the teaching staff was gone

when we returned in the fall, as one of the first things to be cut from the budget was non-tenured employees. The staff that was left struggled to maintain last year's standards, with poor quality books and less money available for teaching aids such as films and slides. Ditto-mad teachers were forced to reduce the number they used, because paper supplies were reduced.







The food was now fresh, hot, and even good tasting. Unfortunately, students had to wait in incredibly long lines before they could purchase these new treats. The new buildings also housed new band and drama rooms, as well as dressing rooms.

Yet while Miraleste was placidly munching French fries, the world scene became increasingly turbulent. The Shah of Iran was deposed, and several new






governments were instated. As a result of the rioting and demonstrations in Iran many Iranian families sent their children to live in the United States with relatives. Some of these Iranian students attended Miraleste, and although they sometimes had difficulty with the language, most fitted right in.

While Iran was turbulent, in the Mid-

dle East an uneasy peace between Israel and Egypt was arranged by President Carter during a summit conference at Camp David. However, in the Far East, the Communists were at war as first Vietnam invaded Cambodia and then China invaded Vietnam. The world held its breath, wondering if the USSR









would enter the fray and start World War III.

Meanwhile Miraleste was struggling with three new speed bumps the district installed on the driveway to keep vandals from destroying the gate. First they were too high, so midnight marauders attacked them with pickaxes and gasoline. The revised version wasn't much better, but at least they

didn't wear holes in cars' mufflers.

Other changes in the campus were less momentous. A new plexi-glass bulletin board for the hall by the main office was obtained by the student council, which also paid for the new signs in the gym. The city of Rancho Palos Verdes donated a set of benches that provided a new eating area by the TAB.
