
Career Center





Leadership Camp Starts the Marauder Spirit





The Banner squad proudly carried the school name at every game and parade. They also performed well with exciting routines.








Spirit Week Brings Victory for All


















The bands playing at dances included Ace, Higher Ground, Windfield Summit, and Zedekiah.










Our Special Education program was going strong, and the Work Experience students were fortunate to have Dr. Xenos helping them to choose the right career.
























Kimbrell Leads Varsity to C.I.F. for Third Year

















Sophs Do It Big






Girls' Spikers Work the Net





Strongest Tennis Team Ever







For the year 1979-1980, it was definitely an eventful world scene. Here we will capture some of the highlights.




As we usher in the 1980's this year will be remembered for its multi-crises: American hostages, energy, Afghanistan, even the reality of selective service, women included.
