



## Passage of Time


a gift so precious a gift so precious

made still for a moment made still for a moment on these pages.



## Marauders Soar to Sky High Levels


From tests to lunches to finally filling out college applications, high school has its rewards as well as its setbacks. We have learned a lot, not only in classes but also about ourselves as individuals.




### **Getting Back** Into the Groove



We've been through many obstacles as a class and have proven that we are a SUCCESS. Don't ever let anyone tell you otherwise. Congratulations to you all!!




### This Is It . . . Then It's Over


# CLASSES COMPETE TO BE AT THE TOP




#### Memories to Last a Lifetime

Each one of us contributed to the special moments of high school. We will remember the good ole days gone by and keep them as our








#### The CIF Triumph:




members: Joan Cragin, Julie Gleason, Sandra Enriquez de Jesus, Andrea Stockert, Peggy Toll, and Wendy Wright.


and Richard Hynes.

To conclude the year's activities, the Drill Team performed at the "Farewell" assembly on June.














#### BAND ON THE MARCH




Their repetoire, including such songs as: "Johnny B. Goode," "Sea of Love", and such classics as "Black, Black, Black, was not an easy one at that.












## PSYCH'S BABY BOOM








## PHYSICS BREAK NEW GROUND



## Dancin' The Night Away






















## Winter Spirit Spreads Cheer






#### CLUBS DISPLAY FASHION FLAIR









## **GAMES PEOPLE PLAY**


#### SNOOPY!!!










#### A Learning Experience

## Varsity Polo Takes The Gold






## Frosh/Soph Talent Explodes





## Makin' History






#### Girls' Tennis Catches Fire
















#### **ABOVE EXPECTATIONS**




#### Better Than Ever!








# BOUNCING TO SUCCESS




#### A TRUE TEAM


#### A WRESTLING REVIVAL










#### JV EARNS SOME RESPECT







#### ON THE BALL



















#### VARSITY TRIES TO EXCEL








# VOLLEYBALL "SIX PACKS" LEAGUE









#### ON THE ROAD TO PERFECTION



### SWIMMERS SPLASH FORWARD


This year's Miraleste swim team was one of the largest and strongest in Marauder history!



#### **FORENSICS**




The School Board attempts to legislate policies in the best interests of the community. The policies are then put into effect by the District Administration. It is necessary that the School Board insure a better educational system.

This past year was a busy one for the School Board. Many important issues were discussed and decided on. The results of these issues were very critical, for they will determine the future of our school district.







#### PRINCIPAL'S ADVISORY COUNCIL



On September 15, about 500 miles south of Newfoundland, **the Titanic** was found over 13,000 feet down in the Atlantic by the unmanned diving platform ARGO.

On September 19, **Mexico City** was struck by a devastating 8.1 earthquake, leveling the entire city and killing thousands. It was followed a few days later by a quake measuring 7.5.

In early September, the head of the K.G.B. in England, defected, naming over 20 top Russian spies in England. Later, the Soviet Union deported 20 Englishmen suspected of being spies.

A Trans World Airlines jet with 145 passengers and eight crew members was hijacked in Athens, Greece. Most of the hostages were released within days, but the remaining 39 hostages were held for 17 days. One American was killed.

Four Palestinian terrorists hijacked the Italian cruise liner **Achille Lauro.** One American was killed. Later the ship was released. The Egyptian government agreed to return the hijackers to the P.L.O. However, the hijackers were inter cepted by American jets as they were flown out of Egypt. They were then returned to Italy.

In mid-February, elections were held in the Philippines between President Ferdinand Marcos and Corazon Aquino. The election, however, was seriously tainted and cheating occured in many places. Marcos won the election, but was forced to flee the country leaving Aquino the leader.





In Haiti, during early February, the population was on the verge of a revolution. Francois ("Papa Doc") Duvalier was forced to flee or be killed by the people. The U.S. flew Duvalier to France where he was allowed to stay for a short time.

#### NATION

On October 3, the first flight of the Space Shuttle ATLANTIS took place. Even though the launch time and payload were kept a secret, it was later disclosed that the payload was two military satellites.

The first anti-satellite missle was sent up to destroy an obsolete satellite. While the test was successful, it received heavy opposition from the Soviet government.

An entire city block was destroyed in Philadelphia. Police tried to evict members of the radical group, MOVE, from their fortified row house by dropping a small bomb on the building. A fire was started by the device and about 60 houses were destroyed.

In mid-November, President Reagan and Soviet leader Gorbachev met for the first time in Geneva. Although no actual arms policies were set, the leaders did talk for quite some time and got to know each other.

A **Delta Airlines** jetliner crashed near Dallas in August, killing 137 people. Thirty-four people survived the crash, but five died of injuries later. The plane encountered a severe wind shear as it plunged to the ground.

#### MILESTONES

Four prominent actors died in late 1985: Orson Wells,70, died of a heart attack; Lloyd Nolan, 83, died of lung cancer; Rock Hudson, 59, died from the disease AIDS; Yul Brynner, 65, died of cancer.

On September 30, Charles F. Richter, died at the age of 85. He became world famous with his invention of the Richtor Scale used to measure the size of earthquakes.

On October 1, **E.B. White**, author of many books including the children's classic, *Charolette's Web*, died at the age of 86.



#### **SPORTS**

Cincinatti Reds player-manager **Pete Rose** broke Ty Cobb's career hit record in September; The historic No. 4,192 hit was a single to left field on a 2-1 pitch from San Diego Padres Eric Show with one out in the bottom of the first inning.

The Kansas City Royals won the World Series. Royal's pitcher **Bret Saberhagen** pitched a fire-lifter to give the Royals the World Series crown over the St. Louis Cardinals. Saberhagen, the winner of two series games, was named the Most Valuable Player in the series.

The Chicago Bears won the **Superbowl**. The game between the Bears and the New England Patriots was a very unequal game in which the Patriots were dealt crushing blows on every play, enhanced by many a bad call on the part of the referees.





#### LOCAL

Rancho Palos Verdes sued Rolling Hills for damages to the Portugese Bend area in R.P.V. The Land in R.H. is pushing the area into the ocean forcing all of R.P.V.'s road-repair budget to-be spent on the area. R.P.V. felt that R.H. should help with the repair bills.

In the Peninsula Center, Finley's Jewelers was robbed of over \$300,000 worth of jewelry. The bandits were spotted on the San Diego Freeway, a high speed chase followed and shots were fired between the robbers and the police.







#### THEY CHALLENGED THEIR DREAMS

"Obviously a major malfunction." Houston's Johnson Space Center representative, Steve Nesbitt said, seconds after the explosion of the Space Shuttle Challenger.

January 28, 1986, the Space Shuttle Challenger and its crew were lost forever. The nation listened carefully, cried simultaneously, and were vicariously united through the sorrow and grief antagonized by the explosion. Never since the Kennedy assassination had so many people been touched by such a tragedy. The seven crew members, Christa McAuliffe Dick Scobee, Judy Resnik, Ronald McNair,

Gregory Jarvis, Michael Smith, and Ellison Onizuka were commemorated in memorial service three days





following the incident. "We will never forget them, nor the last time we saw them...," said **President Reagan.** 

The shuttle trip was significant in that for the first time "a civilian," (school teacher Christa McAuliffe) would travel through space. Christa, as she became known to all, was to teach from space, her lessons were directed toward the millions of school children to introduce them to what space was like. Within 73 seconds after takeoff those lessons would no longer be heard. As in the words of John Gillespie Magee, and echoed by the President, "WE SALUTE OUR HEROES, GOD BLESS THEM ALL."
