It is these outstanding qualities that led us to choose Coach Graves. He is a valued faculty member and friend. Miraleste would not be the same without him.






























Leaders Live in Luxury at Lake Arrowhead






















ASB Officers President's Message



...except maybe Powderpuff Football. But hey, did we show them how to play or what?


... Except maybe class competition. But our time would come.


















Band: The Back Beat of Marander Spirit



ball room. This year's theme was "Moonlight Mystique." The couples danced to the music of KROQ's DJ, Jed the Fish, under an arch of colorful balloons.









Miraleste Steps Into Spring Fashion


Dancing Up A Storm






Flour Children




Valiant Effort Pulls Team Together


The Follies: Comedy Relief AT M.H.S.























Girls' League

Key Club






This year has been an active and fulfilling one for all of Interact's members. The amount of time that Interact's members spent working together resulted in many new friendships and a strong sense of unity within the club.

Quill and Scroll





Drama Club



"If there was ever a Mrs. Miraleste High School, then Marion Hanson would fit that qualification," said Principal John White. So it is befitting that on October 23, Marion Hanson was selected as the 1986 recipient of the Claude E. Norcross Educator of the Year Award at the high school level.

Marion Hanson began teaching English at Miraleste eight years ago, but her involvement with the school began much earlier. Two of her daughters attended Miraleste on its opening day. As an MHS parent, Marion Hanson was actively involved in raising money for the construction of our swimming pool. She's also well known because of her extensive involvement in extracurricular activities. In addition to being voted Marauders' Most Loyal Fan by various teams, she is also an honorary member of the Pep Squad. Other extra-curricular activities of hers include sponsorship of the Key Club, as well as having sponsored the National Honor Society for seven years.

As co-chairperson of the English Department, Marion Hanson created an accountability system for lost books and received \$2,000 from the Innovative Project Committee to augment the school's collection of world literature class sets. As a teacher she encourages students to enter writing contests throughout the year. This year, three of her students took first, second and third place awards in the Allbright American Essay Contest, and another received the very prestigious writing award from the National Council of Teachers of English Achievement. In addition, 90 percent of her advanced placement students scored a "3" or better on the A.P. exam. She is also currently involved in the National Council of Teachers of English and is a judge for literary magazine contests. Marion is on district committees for implementation of Model Curriculum Standards and revision of the Writing Project.



Well Deserved Recognition

Young Educator of the Year Award winner for the Redondo Beach area, **Linda Kurt**, is pleased at being recognized for something she enjoys doing. This award is for outstanding teachers ranging in age from 21 to 35 years of age. Eligible educators can teach at any level, from elementary to high school.

Mr. White recommended **Mrs. Kurt** for this award due to her exceptional record as a Physics teacher. She has managed to dramatically increase the size of all her Physics classes in only a few years.

After the principal's recommendation, **Mrs. Kurt** took a short test which helped the judges of the contest compare her to other teacher also in the competition.

The questions, which she described as "fairly vague" involved such ideas as how she handles disciplinary problem and how she tries to explain difficult concepts to a student that doesn't understand. Overall, the questions dealt with how a teacher teaches.

In addition to her responses on the test, Mrs. Kurt's school related extra-curricular activities were also taken into account. As Girl's Swim Coach, NHS Advisor, Physics Club Advisor, and Administrative Advisory Board Member, Mrs. Kurt leads a busy life on campus.

As the winner of the Redondo Beach area award, **Mrs. Kurt** automatically became a state semi-finalist, and now is one of the five finalists for the statewide competition.

Torreon Says Goodbye to Mrs. Covey ==


