




Saturday Night Live



Incidents That Made It Big




Also, a number of airplane crashes have occurred this year. In Indiana, a vengeful ex-employee was responsible for a crash that killed all on board.




Famous Faces

The year has indeed given us many lasting memories.






The Lakers led by Earvin "Magic" Johnson won the 1987 NBA Championship and their quest for two-in-arow continued in 1988.

X-mas Tree Sales






Seventh and Eighth Grade Activities

Winners in Spirit





Serves Up A Storm, Again!





On the day of the game the team was so intent on what lay before them that all else was of little importance. School, friends, and all other activities were forgotten or ignored.


On the team's arrival at the gym, anxiety could be felt in the air. Just in warming up and strectching out, Miraleste showed its determination.










Out A Great Season


Teamwork Is Successful


Stars in the Making
