## Fiesta Miraleste







We took the school by storm and did everything possible to make ourselves known. The potential of the class of 1989 was obvious from the start.




### The World Outside Miraleste



























### The Powder Puff Scandal


It was a calm, peaceful suburban town called Palos Verdes, but on the weekend of February 10th-13th, war was declared between the Marauder seniors and juniors!!!



### Le Marauder Cafe












## Girls' Service Club







## **CSF**




Teen PALs met at lunch and at night on campus to discuss the progress of the club and share counseling experiences.

Under the direction of president **Steve Walther** and vice-president **Shana Aelony**, Teen PALs was one of the more active clubs on campus.




#### German


#### Art






#### Math Club


# New League


# League


## Girls' Basketball Team

As sure as spring comes, so does softball season for Miraleste. The Girls' Softball Team


had high hopes and great expectations.


#### the Wins
