
As our sophomore year rolled around, there came a fork in the road. We chose the right way and our plan went into action. Our spirit and involve-


Mini Marauders

Feb. 25 — Seeing that the allied forces had virtually wiped out the Iraqi troops as well as much of their country, Saddam Hussein loses Kuwait and is ordered by the U.N. and the Soviet Union to not only abide by the U.N. resolutions, but also to pay all necessary reparations for the re-building of Kuwait.


The team also had many new, young faces this year. The standout from last






Boys Water Polo

"I never had a team that had such depth of talent. We had people who didn't get much playing time that would have started on any other South Bay team."


Among the "unsung" standouts


The main scorer for the Marauders was **Kristin** "**Terminator**" **Ostegard**. She scored most of her points with her powerful spike that



Cross Country runs into CIF



ing and strong rebounding. Coming off the bench was the strong contributor **Damato Philip**.




Girls Soccer Sweeps Up


High Speed Competition

Students from various countries such as Germany, Holland, and France arrived on the Miraleste campus at the beginning of the year and added their own unique values and traditions to the student body here.

The French exchange student program run by **Madame Maier** this last summer also worked out quite well. Many of the Miraleste students who hosted built up friendships that will last a lifetime.




The director of the marching band was Mr. Albanese, He has been a music instructor for many years and has brought the M.H.S. marching band to new heights.



At last, the seniors have reached their final destination: graduation. For them, the view is victorious and well deserved. Good luck and congratulations!


